

COMMUNITY CONCERTS

Community Concerts occur throughout the year. These are concerts that take place off campus for service organizations, family gatherings, and community outreach. The number of Community Concerts varies per choir. Through these Community Concerts your child will grow in independence, responsibility, community awareness, and collaborative skills, both musically and socially.

EXCHANGE CONCERTS

These are concerts when MVHS choirs combine with another high school, organization or University and perform informally for each other. Usually there is a combined number that the choirs collaborate on. Occasionally audiences are invited to attend, but more often they are a chance for student-to-student exchanges. They very often include a shared meal so there is time for small group conversations.

WORKSHOPS AND CLINICS

We bring in a variety of clinicians to work with the choirs. They include – voice lessons, adjudication, choral techniques, and visiting choir demonstrations.

TOUR PERFORMANCES

The performances on tour vary greatly. They always include formal concerts with the focus on audience attendance, shared concerts with local choirs, outreach concerts, outstanding venues where the priority is acoustical experience, impromptu performances at restaurants, school assemblies, and more.

IN-CLASS PERFORMANCES

These take place during class periods. They are additional opportunities for students to perform in small groups and as a soloist

SETTING UP YOUR CHARMS ACCOUNT

Charms is a web-based organizing tool created especially for the needs of school performing arts programs. Most important: Please be patient. This system may be new to you, but if you move through it slowly, it works quite well.

BEGIN SET UP

We will send out a personal direct link when we enter you in the system. You will have 24 hours to use that link. If you miss the window you can email us and we will resend the link - which will work on parent and student email. OR if you have your student near you because the reset info will go to their email.

2. When you reach the screen that says "Please Enter Your School Code", enter: mvchoir



3. On the page that asks for "Student Area Password" enter your student's MVHS student number



If this is your first time logging in to Charms, you will receive an email with directions on how to create your password.

IF IT SAYS IT DOESN'T RECOGNIZE YOU - FILL OUT THE FORM BENEATH THAT STATEMENT. IT WILL SEND THE LINK ONLY TO THE STUDENT EMAIL

4. You will then be asked to change your password If you ever forget and need it changed back to the student ID let Jill know and she can change it for you.

6. Please enter the information requested in the boxes, and click the green Update button when completed.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING CHARMS

Q: Is this the same Charms used by other Performing Arts Departments at MVHS?

A: Yes, but it is a completely separate account. We decided it was better not to mix the programs because the financials are handled separately. If you have a student who participates in more than Performing Art Class, you will have a separate account for your student in each Charms.

Q: What if I have more than one student?

A: Each student's account, account information, and payment information is recorded independently of any other student. That means that after working in one of your children's accounts, you'll need to EXIT CHARMS, and re-enter using your other student's ID number. This assures the privacy of individual student accounts, and prevents mistakes that might be made when several families have the same last name

TICKET POLICIES

Ticket information will be distributed at the beginning of the school year. You can order all your tickets in the beginning of the school year, or purchase each concert separately. Be advised that **MOST EVENTS** sell out MONTHS in advance, so plan to purchase early to avoid problems later.

TICKET TYPES

All events held in MVHS Spartan Theatre will include "General" tickets, as well as "Infant/Child". Young children may not attend without tickets, as it risks violating our maximum occupancy limits. A \$2 ticket is required for all children age 2 and under, so that we may keep accurate admission records. Some events will include "Youth" tickets for ages 3-17.

PURCHASING TICKETS

Advance tickets can be purchased online. Online tickets sales require a credit card, and will add on a processing fee at the time of purchase. You'll have the option to print your tickets at home, send them to your mobile device, or you can give us your name at the door. <u>NOTE:</u> tickets can be purchased with cash/check through your teacher in class. Payments should be made in full, cash or checks to MVHS. Confirmation will be sent to the email you provide with your ticket order, or by looking up your name.

REFUND AND EXCHANGES

No refunds are given at any time. Requests for exchanges must be made in email no less than 48 hours in advance. If you have tickets you will not use, you are welcome to sell them yourself, or donate them back to the program.

BOX OFFICE

Tickets can be purchased online up to the start of each show (or until sold out - whichever comes first) If we have remaining tickets the box office will open one hour before show time. We will not refund unused tickets, but we accept them back as donations. Sold-out events will form a stand-by line, but admission is not guaranteed.

ADMISSION AND SEATING

Doors open approximately 20 minutes before show time. All tickets will be scanned upon admission, including tickets printed at home and those on mobile devices. All seating is open seating, and food is not permitted in the theater. Guests who arrive with infants will be asked to visit the box office if they do not have a ticket for their child.

COSTUMES

Students will choose between the two options for each choir. Gender fluid students have the option of renting both and deciding on the day of the concert which feels comfortable that day.

NOTE: If you have personal or religious reasons that require extra skin coverage or head coverings we can always find a solution that works. Please reach out to us - all things are possible \bigcirc

Students are responsible for keeping their costumes hung properly and in good condition. All costumes must be transported in the bags provided.

COSTUME CARE AND CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

All Costumes

- Must be transported in the garment and travel bags provided.
- GARMENT bags are washable. Smell them regularly to decide if it needs a washing.
- When you are not using the costumes they should be hung in your closet with the bottom of the dresses outside of the bag to avoid long term creasing
- TORN OR FRAGILE SEAMS. If you find any seams beginning to open, tell Jill right away. Do not wait for a tear. Your seamstresses will work quickly to repair your costume **All Jewelry**
- Must be transported in the containers provided

<u>Ties</u>

• Dry Clean Only. Do not wash

Madrigal Formal Dresses & Burgundy Hooded Cape

• WASH EACH ITEM ALONE. Each Dress and Cape MUST be washed by itself, with no other laundry items. This is to protect the garment – the fabric's texture and color.

• UNSNAP SKIRT Before washing be sure to unsnap the side skirt snaps; if you do not do this, the skirt is likely to tear at the snap point.

• TREAT WITH SPRAY AND WASH. You can treat the underarms with a treatment like Spray N Wash to remove stains and body odors.

• COLD WATER, GENTLE CYCLE, GENTLE SOAP. Washable in cold water, delicate cycle. Gentle laundry soaps only. The Burgundy fabric WILL bleed. DO NOT WASH WITH YOUR CREAM DRESS! (Your cream dress will turn pink.)

• USE A LAUNDRY BAG. If you have a top-loading washer with a center spindle, you MUST use a laundry bag to wash your dress. Large bags are available at shops like Target and Ikea. A bag will protect the dress from anything on the spindle that might harm the fabric.

• LINE DRY only on a hanger, using the hanging ribbons if needed to keep dress on the hanger.

• COOL IRON ONLY! Iron only with a medium to cool iron, do not iron on a cotton setting or you will burn the fabric. NOTE: Iron on the wrong side of fabric and with A LOW HEAT WITH IRON. The striped fabric of your skirt front is VERY sensitive to heat. It will burn very quickly with a too hot iron, so use a cool iron only

Tour Dresses, Pink Skirt, Black and Blue Concert Dresses

• WASH with like colors. Be very cautious not to mix with fabrics that will bleed and change the color of the material.

• TREAT WITH SPRAY AND WASH. You can treat the underarms with a treatment like Spray N Wash to remove stains and body odors.

• COLD WATER, BRIGHT COLORS. Washable in cold water.

• LINE DRY TOUR DRESSES, BLACK AND BLUE CONCERT DRESSES only on a hanger, this will prevent shrinkage and preserve the life of the dress

• LINE DRY OR TUMBLE DRY Pink skirt can be put in the dryer if you choose on Medium heat.

IRON as needed

Doublets & Velvet Cape & Velvet Cap

• WASH EACH ITEM ALONE. Each Doublet and Cape MUST be washed by itself, with no other laundry items. This is to protect the garment – the fabric's texture and color.

• TREAT WITH SPRAY AND WASH. You can treat the underarms with a treatment like Spray N Wash to remove stains and body odors.

• COLD WATER, GENTLE CYCLE, GENTLE SOAP. Washable in cold water, delicate cycle. Gentle laundry soaps only.

• LINE DRY only on a hanger

• COOL IRON ONLY with a medium to cool iron. Do not iron on a cotton setting or you will burn the fabric. Iron on the wrong side of fabric.

Tour Shirt, Black Shirt, Renaissance Shirts

• WASH with like colors. Be very cautious not to mix with fabrics that will bleed and change the color of the material. The Burgundy shirt will MOST LIKELY bleed.

• TREAT WITH SPRAY AND WASH. You can treat the underarms with a treatment like Spray N Wash to remove stains and body odors.

- COLD WATER, BRIGHT COLORS. Washable in cold water.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Each year we find out student needs, and then make the effort to find funds to help support so no child is denied participation. The choral department can be divided into two parts:

- 1) Onsite Program includes Choir Camp
- 2) Choir Tour

We must make sure that all students are able to participate fully in the Onsite Program first, and financial assistance is awarded with that priority in mind. We also make every effort to assist with the Choir Tour. If you would like to apply for financial assistance fill out the scholarship request found in the form packet, and submit with your forms by August 18, 2023

FUNDRAISING

There will be several opportunities throughout the year for you to raise money to pay for part or all of your costs in the MVHS vocal program. You can significantly reduce the amount you or your family have to pay out-of-pocket by taking advantage of the fundraisers available. Fundraising can also be used to make a fair share donation.

PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS

ONLINE CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS – DIRECTLY THROUGH CHARMS

You CAN make a payment online through CHARMS. We have integrated Affinipay, a credit card processor into our CHARMS system. This allows parents to make credit card payments directly into charms to make it easier to track payments. NOTE: There is a credit card process and handling fee of 3.45% per transaction.

CHECKS - PAYABLE TO MVHS CHOIR

All Payments must be made in clearly labeled **GREEN** Choral Department Payment Envelopes. Please DO NOT submit any money directly to the school bookkeeper.

All choir deposits MUST be turned into the choir payment lock box in the choir room.

CASH - SUBMIT EXACT CHANGE

Submit exact change. Overpayment will result in a credit to your account, but will not be returned. All Payments must be made in clearly labeled **GREEN** Choral Department Payment Envelopes. Please DO NOT submit any money directly to the school bookkeeper.

All choir deposits MUST be turned into the choir payment lock box in the choir room.

GREEN PAYMENT ENVELOPES CAN BE FOUND ON THE WALL IN THE CHOIR ROOM MONEY MATTER FAQ

•The Choir department uses a web-based platform called **Charms** to manage all Student accounts.

•Parents must register in Charms and link to their students' account. You will receive an email request sometime between June - August with instructions on how to complete your registration.

Once registered, you will be able to login and view your student's account history.

•Student and parent members from 21-22 that are continuing in the 22-23 school year **will not** need to re-register. However, please notify us if any of your contact information has changed so we can update the profile. Any carry-over funds (if applicable) will be transferred accordingly and reflected on the student account as a credit.

Payments for student accounts can be made directly in Charms via credit card. There will be a 3.45% charge.
Payments can also be made by Check (made payable to MVHS Choir) or Cash. These payments must be placed in the green choral department payment envelope, filled out completely with required student information and placed in the lockbox located in the choir room.

What is the Refund Policy?

Refunds are only for PAYMENTS you make by credit card, check or cash directly into your choir account. You will not receive any refund For **Donations** which includes: Scholarship, work to earn, projects for payment, fundraising, and direct donations and matches. The amount available is dependent on our payment schedule with the vendors.

What happens to the money I have from DONATIONS (scholarship, fundraisers, WTE, PP, matches) if I drop the class?

It is transferred into the SCHOLARSHIP Program.

What happens to my scholarship award if I drop choir?

Funds are transferred back into the SCHOLARSHIP program.

SCHOLARSHIP DONATIONS

DONATE - REAY FAMILY MATCHING FUNDS

USING DONATIONS AS PAYMENT

If you intend to use a donation as part of your payment for choir, it must be received in full by December 31, 2023. Because donations processed through the district office can sometimes take a long time to get all the way to the choir department - you should be sure those donations are made no later than October 31, 2023. If for any reason you anticipate a donation being received in the choir department on your behalf AFTER December 31, 2023 you will have to make your full payment upfront and if the donation does arrive we can then refund you. We must have all payments made according to the payment schedule in order for us to meet our vendor due date.

MATCHING FUNDS

Double the impact of your gift (or more!) through an employer and employee corporate matching program. Your employer may match any contribution you give to the Mountain View Choir Program through Mountain View High School. Some companies also match contributions from retirees and board members.

Many local corporations offer their employees matching gift programs in which they match donations made by employees to eligible organizations. When an employee donates to an eligible organization, the employer donates an additional amount, often equal or greater than the employee's donation. Some corporations may also have corporate giving programs in which they provide monetary donations to organizations where employees volunteer regularly.

A matching gift or a volunteer grant will provide additional support to the HUG (Help Us Go) Fund. HUG funds help us provide scholarship assistance to our hard-working MVHS choir students, so that all singers may participate in all events and opportunities regardless of their personal financial situations.

Requesting a matching gift or volunteer grant is normally a quick process that the employee initiates. It commonly involves an electronic submission process, although sometimes a paper process might be required. Depending on the system used by your employer, you may need to use Mountain View High School's Federal Tax ID (77-0209871) or its National Center for Educational Statistics ID (062631003930) to process the request. Those IDs may also be needed if you need your giving program to create a profile for the high school.

For questions regarding your company's programs, please contact your employer's HR or community giving department. The necessary information is usually available on your company's internal online resources. For questions regarding submitting a matching gift or volunteer grant request to the Mountain View Choir Program, please reach out to Jill directly.

Generally, the IRS treats public school districts as government instrumentalities. As such, they are exempt from federal income tax and eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions from individuals under Section 170(c)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code. All gifts are tax-deductible to the fullest extent of the law. Mountain View High School's Federal Tax ID is 77-0209871. As a reminder, donations cannot be made in remission or in lieu of other fair share payments or in return for any other goods or services.
